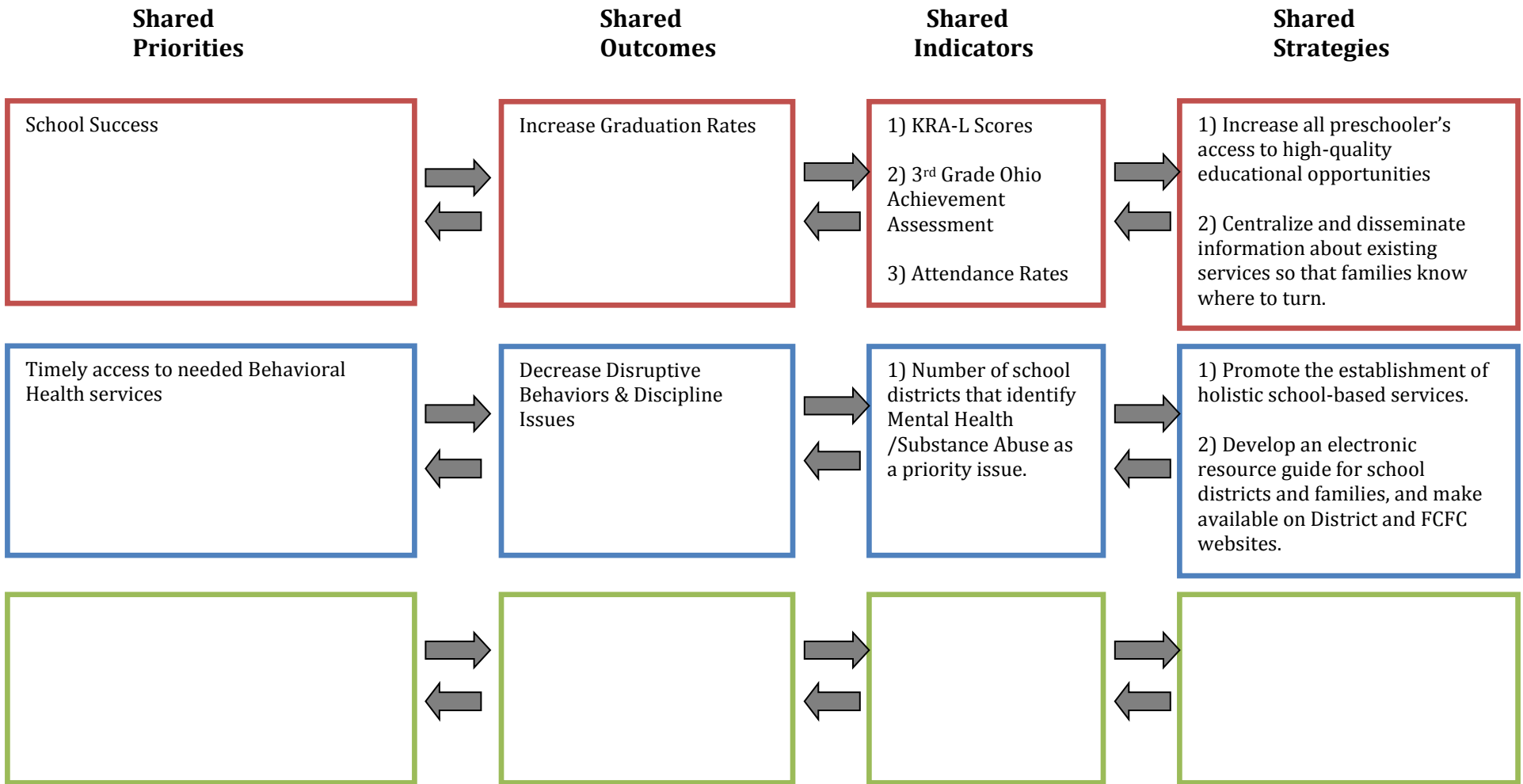

The indicators listed above are county-level composites; as such, they do not accurately reflect individual high-need districts. For example, the Band 1 KRA-L Score for Akron City Schools is 23%, as compared to Green Local Schools, which is 4.8%. As interventions, and/or strategies are developed to support **School Success** it is likely that more resources will be directed to high-need communities.

This indicator is a county-level composite; as such, it does not accurately reflect individual high-need districts. For example, the number of disciplinary actions per 100 students for Akron City Schools in 2012-13 was 105.7, as compared to Revere Local Schools, which was 3.8.
